

Clinical Services Division






Through October 2013, the Clinical Services Division has had 8,500 clinical visits.

Starting November 1, 2013, all clients seen in the Clinical Services Division, with the exception of Medicare patients receiving a flu vaccine, are entered into the Electronic Medical Record (EMR). This will assist with future data collection including unduplicated client counts.



FOOD ESTABLISHMENT INSPECTIONS




By tracking and monitoring these violations, staff can observe trends of the observations in the field and implement approaches to reduce the occurrence of these violations..




