Subject Title: Action to adopt, on second reading, Bill No. 115 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 12, WATER, SEWERAGE, AND DRAINAGE, CHAPTER 12.12, SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT, SECTION 12.12.047, LANDFILL RATES AND FEES, BY INCREASING OUT-OF-COUNTY RATES 25 PERCENT FOR COMPACTED AND UNCOMPACTED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE AND CLASS III WASTE, INCREASING IN-COUNTY TONNAGE RATES FOR COMPACTED AND UNCOMPACTED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE AND CLASS III WASTE BY 4.82 PERCENT AND INCREASING IN-COUNTY MINIMUMS BY \$1.00 AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

Staff Summary: Staff recommends that the Board of Supervisors consider an increase in landfill rate fees to support general fund operations and capital requirements, with a 25% increase to all out-of-county rates for Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) compacted and uncompacted and Class III (construction/demolition) wastes, a 4.82% CPI increase to in-county tonnage fees for compacted and uncompacted MSW and Class III waste and \$1.00 increase to the in-county minimums (\$5 vs \$4).

Recommended Board Action: I move to adopt, on second reading, Bill No. 115 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 12, WATER, SEWERAGE, AND DRAINAGE, CHAPTER 12.12, SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT, SECTION 12.12.047, LANDFILL RATES AND FEES, BY INCREASING OUT-OF-COUNTY RATES 25 PERCENT FOR COMPACTED AND UNCOMPACTED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE AND CLASS III WASTE, INCREASING INCOUNTY TONNAGE RATES FOR COMPACTED AND UNCOMPACTED MUNICIPAL SOLID WASTE AND CLASS III WASTE BY 4.82 PERCENT AND INCREASING INCOUNTY MINIMUMS BY \$1.00 AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

Explanation for Recommended Board Action: The City's landfill rates are below market averages. Staff recommends an increase to specific items in the landfill rate structure as follows: a 25% increase to all out-of-county rates for MSW compacted and uncompacted and Class III (construction/demolition) wastes, a 4.82% CPI increase to in-county tonnage fees for compacted and uncompacted MSW and Class III waste and a \$1.00 increase to the in-county minimums (\$5 vs \$4). The revenues generated from this rate increase will support general fund operational costs and capital requirements.

Staff has provided the appropriate notice, Business Impact Statement and proposed ordinance revisions to BAWN, the Chamber of Commerce, Waste Management, Inc. and other in-county waste haulers. Notice to the public was also provided through the Nevada Appeal. To date, staff has not received any opposing comments.
