Background/Issues & Analysis

Serving some 1,800 youth, Boys & Girls Clubs of Western Nevada provides a safe, structured and positive environment for young people after school, during holidays and summer vacation. Our many programs are designed to help youth create aspirations for the future, become responsible, caring citizens, and engage in positive behaviors to benefit their physical, intellectual and emotional well-being.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of Western Nevada is part of a nationwide network. Located in every state, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and U.S. military installations overseas, Boys & Girls Clubs are delivering proven programs to millions of young people every day.

The Carson City School District and Boys & Girls Clubs of Western Nevada have been connected since our doors opened 26 years ago, providing a number of services including busing kids to the Club every day after school, successfully providing 16 years of the 21st Century after school program and most recently becoming a pre-school site for the school district.

21st Century Programs

This partnership is a unique, grant-funded after-school program at three schools in the district, Bordewich-Bray Elementary, Empire Elementary, and Mark Twain Elementary. Students from these schools are invited to participate in the 21st Century afterschool programs based on test scores, grades and recommendations by teachers. A member of one of these programs will receive help with

their academics like reading, math and writing as well as take part in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) curriculum, Civics education, and drug and alcohol prevention classes.

The academic portion takes place at each of the schools from 3:15-4:45 PM. During this time, students receive a snack, participate in skill building with their teachers and get help on their homework.

At 4:45, students can ride a bus from each of the schools to Boys & Girls Clubs of Western Nevada for enrichment, including arts, sports, technology and games. This partnership allows for students to reach their full potential academically and socially while still providing a safe environment for them.

Carson City School District Pre-K Program

This partnership is new, as of 2 years ago the School District asked the Club if we would want to be an off school site for a much needed pre-k program in our area. We are the first non-academic partner the school district has used for a site. The program not only allows the school district to support 20 additional kids per year but it gets parents and kids into the Club. As a result of this partnership the Club has opened our doors to the community outside of our older youth members, allowed us to bring parents into the Club and talk about what the Club provides their children and how we support the school district.

The partnership between the district and Club has been long standing, positive and an evolving relationship. As we move forward we hope that we continue to foster and grow not only with the current programs we are offering together but expand and serve more youth.
