Subject Title: For Possible Action: Action to find that the proposed ordinance amending the Carson City Municipal Code Title 12 – <u>Water, Sewerage and Drainage</u>, Chapter 12.03 – <u>Sewer Connection Charges and Use Rates</u>, Section 12.03.020 – <u>Schedule of Rates</u>, by phasing in a five (5) year rate structure effective October 1, 2013 and other matters properly related thereto, does impose a direct and significant economic burden on a business or directly restrict formation, operations or expansion of a business, that a business impact statement has been prepared in compliance with NRS 237, accepted and is on file with the Board of Supervisors. Staff Summary: This ordinance proposes a sewer utility rate schedule, phased in over five (5) years, that generates the revenue necessary to fund current operating and maintenance expenses, debt service, five (5) year capital improvement plan, capital reserve targets and system reinvestment. NRS 237.080 requires that the City prepare a Business Impact Statement when an increase in a fee is contemplated.

BUSINESS IMPACT STATEMENT

The following business impact statement was prepared pursuant to NRS 237.090 to address the proposed impact of an ordinance to amend the Carson City Municipal Code,

TITLE 12, WATER, SEWERAGE AND DRAINAGE, CHAPTER 12.03 – SEWER CONNECTION CHARGES AND USE RATES, SECTION 12.03.020 – SCHEDULE OF RATES, BY REVISING THE RATE STRUCTURE ENSURING EQUITY AMONGST USER CLASSES AND MEETING THE REVENUE REQUIREMENTS TO FUND DEBT FINANCING, CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS, CAPITAL RESERVE TARGETS AND SYSTEM REINVESTMENT; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

 The following constitutes a description of the manner in which comment was solicited from affected businesses, a summary of their response and an explanation of the manner in which other interested persons may obtain a copy of the summary.

a. Notice

Direct mailings were sent to the Carson City Area Chamber of Commerce and the Builders Association of Western Nevada.

Public tours of the wastewater treatment plant were given on April 11, July 10, and July 16, 2013.

Sierra Nevada Forums hosted a public presentation on July 16, 2013.

The Water and Sewer Rate Studies that were presented to the Board of Supervisors, on April 18, 2013 and June 20, 2013, were posted on the Carson City website (www.Carson.org), front page under News & Updates.

The proposed amendments were available for viewing at the Carson City Public Works Department at 3505 Butti Way, Carson City NV 89701.

b. Summary of comments

No comments were received.

 The estimated economic effect of the proposed rule on businesses including, without limitation, both adverse and beneficial effects, and both direct and indirect effects:

a. Adverse effects:

Effective October 1, 2013 and July 1 each year thereafter through 2017, the cost of service shifts will be phased-in over a five (5) year period.


Note: FYE is Fiscal Year Ending. A fiscal year is defined as July 1 - June 30.

b. Beneficial effects:

This ordinance creates financial stability in the wastewater utility for the next five (5) years; it provides the revenue necessary to fund the operating and maintenance expenses, debt service, and capital program, and establishes operating and capital reserves and system reinvestment funding necessary to preserve the utility's financial integrity; it provides a new rate structure that improves equity among customer classes.

c. Direct effects:

The passage of this ordinance redefines the customer classes to single family residential, multifamily residential, low-strength commercial and high-strength commercial.



It generates the revenue necessary to meet operating and maintenance expenses, existing debt financing, new debt financing and provides for system reinvestment funding.



d. Indirect effects:

By passing this ordinance is likely to have indirect effects, however at this time, those effects cannot be quantified.

3. The following constitutes a description of the methods that the governing body of the local government considered to reduce the impact of the proposed ordinance on businesses and a statement regarding whether any, and if so which, of these methods were used:

To reduce the fiscal impact, a five (5) year phase-in strategy is being proposed.

4. The governing body estimates that the annual cost to the local government for enforcement of the proposed ordinance is:

There should be no increase in costs, as Carson City already has a billing operation in place that addresses rates and customer charges every day.

5. The proposed rule provides for a new fee or increases to an existing fee and the total annual amount expected to be collected is:

6. The proposed ordinance includes provisions which duplicate or are more stringent than federal, state or local standards regulating the same activity. The following explains why such duplicative or more stringent provisions are necessary.

The proposed change is not duplicative or more stringent than existing federal, state or local standards.

OBJECTION PROCESS

- If a business believes it is aggrieved by a rule (as defined in NRS 237.060) adopted by the governing body, the business may object by filing a petition in writing with the clerk/secretary of the local government at 201 North Carson Street, Ste. 1, Carson City, NV 89701.
- 2. The governing body will accept such petitions for a period of thirty (30) days following approval of the subject Rule for one of the following reasons:
 - a. The governing body failed to prepare a business impact statement as required pursuant to NRS Chapter 237; or
 - b. The business impact statement prepared by the governing body did not consider or significantly underestimate the economic effect of the ordinance or rule on business.
- 3. Upon receipt of the petition, the clerk/secretary will forward a copy to the local government's attorney, the department/agency that generated the Rule and the local government's manager/chief executive.
- Staff will consider the merits of the petition and forward a recommendation to the governing body.
- 5. The governing body will determine if the petition has merit and direct staff accordingly.
- A sample petition is attached.

PETITION OBJECTING TO ADOPTION OF RULE

NRS 237.100 provides that a business that is aggrieved by an ordinance, regulation, resolution or other type of instrument through which a governing body exercises legislative powers, except pursuant to Chapter 271, 278,278A and 278B of NRS (herein a "Rule") adopted by the governing body may object to all or a part of the Rule by filing a petition. This petition form is provided to assist those who wish to object. The petition must be filed with the clerk/secretary of the local government at **201 North Carson Street, Ste. 1, Carson City, Nevada 89701**, within 30 days after the date on which the Rule was adopted.
