- Successful or non-successful completion of treatment/placement

1st Quarter- October 15, 2011

2nd Quarter- January 15, 2012

3rd Quarter- April 15, 2012


Final Report for 1st year of Contract- July 15, 2012

The school year enrollment numbers will be updated by June of each fiscal year with the current census prior to sending out the allocation to the counties.
