When my fence was installed I was told by the fence company that it had to be back at least 3 feet from the curb and could only be a certain height. The fence at this residence is right next to the curb and there is no variance. Also, the fence is too tall and is not in compliance.

I drove by the day after it was installed and Grant was standing outside and I asked him why, and did he plan on putting barbed wire on the top!!??? He said the height was to keep the deer out. This made me chuckle, as the deer will just try and go through - in between - the wire and get caught! Now that is going to be tragic.

I understand why they installed the fence (to keep their grand-daughter in) but this fence is unsightly! It does not conform to the other fences in the neighborhood and needs to be moved back the required feet and the rods and wire above the fence removed. I realize that there is a large beautiful tree in front, but they can go around the tree and still have plenty of yard.

Also, I think Tahoe Fence - the Company that did the installation - is responsible for a lot of this. They are well aware of the requirements and should not have installed the fence to the curb, or installed the height. They need to accept some responsibility, be held accountable and work with Joan and Grant to move the fence back the required feet.
