ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

The First Judicial District Court issued an Administrative Order filed on March 17, 2020 suspending visitation of juveniles committed at the Juvenile Detention Center for 30 days. The Administrative Order was in response to the recent outbreak of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in Nevada.

On March 18, 2020, Governor Stephen Sisolak closed all non-essential services state-wide and requested all Nevadans stay home to implement social distancing. During this time, it is critical to prevent the spread of COVID-19 among members of the court, counsel, staff, the public, and our valuable community partners;


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that visitation of juveniles committed at the Juvenile Detention Center is suspended until further order of the court.

1 IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the Administrative Order filed on March
2 17, 2020, will continue in full force and effect or until modified or rescinded by a subsequent
3 order.

4 IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the First Judicial District Court Clerk's
5 Office disseminate copies of the order to Carson City City's Manager, Carson City District
6 Attorney, Nevada State Public Defender, Division of Child and Family Services and Court
7 Appointed Special Advocates.
